Featured Article from Midwestern Vascular Surgical Society 2022 Annual Meeting



Presentations from the Midwestern Vascular Surgical Society are preferentially reviewed by the *Journal of Vascular Surgery* portfolio of journals. This article will highlight an article recently accepted from #MWVSS2022 in question and answer format with the first Author, Kyla Bennett. Dr. Bennett. Dr. Bennett is a vascular surgeon and associate professor in the Department of Surgery of the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health in Madison Wisconsin.

QUESTION: Briefly describe the question you were trying to answer and the design of your study to answer this question.

ANSWER: Our goal was to examine the relationship between preservation/sacrifice of hypogastric arteries during aneurysm repair and the development of claudication. We felt there was a gap in the literature with respect to the risk of developing claudication in the aneurysm population in the absence of intraoperative changes to hypogastric flow. The studies addressing the effects of hypogastric flow are often limited to the cohort undergoing changes to the hypogastric flow with no comparator group of similar patients without intraoperative alteration to hypogastric perfusion. To address these questions and to contribute to the discussion on indications for hypogastric flow preservation, we utilized the Veterans' Affairs OVER trial (funded through the VA CSP program #498) population. This aneurysm dataset was optimal because investigators were trained in two important areas critical to this outcome: (1) embolization of the main trunk only of the hypogastric with preservation of the branches and (2) querying at all follow-up visits for the presence of any symptoms of claudication. Our team supplemented the available information by reviewing all the operative notes to ensure we were certain regarding hypogastric flow status in open and endovascular repairs. We then divided the patients into four groups based on these operative notes: those with both hypogastric artieries preserved, those with only the left preserved, those with only the right preserved and those with neither preserved. We then developed a multivariable survival model analyzing the time to onset of buttock claudication.
